Alta Capital Management believes companies with high free cash flow growth yield superior risk-adjusted investment returns. The tenets of our process encompass the following:

- Growth in earnings and free cash flow drives stock prices

- Superior FCF growth with lower EPS variability leads to more resilient, risk-adjusted outcomes

INVESTMENT PROCESS

Companies are identified through a fundamental, bottom-up investment process, beginning with a universe screen that seeks to identify companies that demonstrate financial strength, strong profitability, and a favorable track record.

Further analysis of these firms using Alta's proprietary free cash flow model, helps define the present value of the company. Fundamental analysis validates the strength of the company's management, business, and future performance expectations.

Favorable culmination of this process is the recognition of a security whose current trading value is significantly less than its intrinsic value. For the security to establish a position, the Investment Committee must confirm eligibility, appropriate entry price target, and proper placement within the portfolio.

INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

The Fund's investment objective is to seek long-term growth of capital with lower than market volatility by investing primarily in equity and similar securities issued by high quality companies listed on the New York Stock Exchange, the NASDAQ and American Stock Exchange.

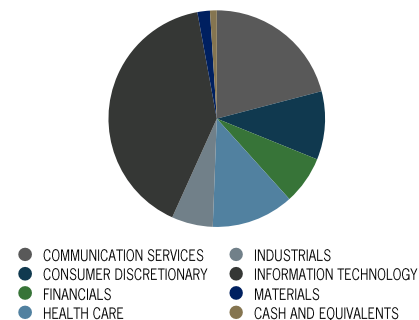

DEFINITIONS

Alpha: Alpha is the excess return of an investment relative to a benchmark return.

Active Share: Active Share represents the proportion of portfolio holdings that differ from those in the benchmark index.

EPS Growth: The earnings growth forecast shows what the consensus is among analysts concerning the company's growth rate over for the previous, current and following year.

EPS Variability: EPS Variability measures the variability of annual EPS over the last five years. This statistic examines companies' absolute earnings patterns rather than their earnings growth rates.

Net Margin: Net margin is the percentage of revenue remaining after all operating expenses, interest, taxes and preferred stock dividends (but not common stock dividends) have been deducted from a company's total revenue. The net margin illustrates how much of each dollar collected by a company as revenue translates into profit.

Return on Equity: Return on Equity (ROE) is a measure of profitability that calculates how many dollars of profit a company generates with each dollar of shareholders' equity. A company with a higher or rising ROE is deemed to be rewarding shareholders through efficient use of shareholders' capital.

Return on Invested Capital (ROIC): ROIC shows how much profit a company generates on its capital base. The higher the ratio, the more profit it generates as a percentage of its invested capital. The company's net income is found in the income statement. The components of the company's invested capital are found in the balance sheet.

P/E Ratio (12-month forward): The forward price to earnings ratio is a company's stock price relative to its expected earnings per share over the next twelve months. The ratio is a valuation measurement.

PEG (NTM P/E divided by EPS Growth): The PEG FY1 Estimate ratio divides a company's FY1 P/E ratio by its earnings growth rate. The ratio is designed to measure the balance between growth and valuation.

The S&P 500 Index measures the performance of the 500 largest publicly held companies actively traded in the United States. The Russell 1000 Growth Index measures the performance of the large cap growth segment of the U.S. equity universe and includes those Russell 1000 companies with higher price-to-book ratios and higher forecasted growth values. Alta Capital Management Large Cap Quality Growth uses the Russell 1000 Growth as its primary index comparison.
